Why are you serving on the HNF Board?

During a 2005 routine colonoscopy, my gastroenterologist discovered my primary neuroendocrine tumor in my small intestine. An MRI confirmed liver metastasis, and I received a diagnosis of carcinoid syndrome. Resection removed the primary tumor and a dozen affected lymph nodes, but the hepatic tumors were too many and too large to remove. I had tumors in all four liver lobes with the largest at 7.5cm, about the size of a small grapefruit. My oncologist recommended a watch-and-see approach, but the tumors started to grow rapidly. When my oncologist advised me to put my affairs in order, my wife Teresa and I refused to listen and began to research options.

We chose PRRT treatments in Bad Berka, Germany, and my liver tumors decreased by about 20%, but they again began to grow. After numerous Gallium 68 scans, it was confirmed that all my tumors were in the liver. With this knowledge, I opted to have the liver-targeted Sirs-Spheres treatment with similar results as PRRT. My interventional radiologist recommended chemoembolization. I had the 1st chemoembolization treatment in December 2012. The MRI scan a month later showed the tumors had been destroyed. I had further chemoembolization treatments in January and February. Subsequent scans have confirmed no evidence of active liver tumors.

Since my diagnosis and treatment, I have spoken to more than a hundred NET patients from all over the world. The Healing NET Foundation has been a critical source of crucial information to both patients and physicians. I serve on the Healing NET Foundation Board of Directors to support this vital educational effort. I hope to make a difference in the lives of my fellow NET patients not only to obtain excellent medical advice but to also become their own educated advocate.
